

## Capital Letters

**When do you use a capital letter?**

- 1. A sentence always begins with a capital letter.**
- 2. A proper noun, like a person's name, begins with a capital letter.**
- 3. A proper noun, like a place, begins with a capital letter.**
- 4. Proper nouns, which are SPECIAL names, begin with a capital letter.  
(Christmas, Easter, June, Monday etc.)**
